





**T**HE FEATURED presentation at the Spring Fling (*see preceding page*) on Apr. 28 will be "Image Storm" by Jacob Mosser III, FPSA, HonNEC.

*Jake is a PSA member from western Massachusetts who was a popular guest speaker for our Mid-Atlantic Chapter a few years ago.*

"Image Storm" is a wide-spectrum photographic experience, a three-projector slide show with supporting music. It is crafted to entertain and inspire those who take pleasure in the art of photography, celebrating classic themes and at the same time unrestrained by conventional boundaries. Approaches as divergent as classic nature photography and edgy photojournalism are visually explored as "the storm" builds from pastoral images and music to a non-linear crescendo with the energy and feel of a heavy-metal music video.

Jake is an accomplished photographer from N. Reading, MA who has judged and lectured on photography throughout the Northeast and for various photographic organizations in the U.S. and Canada. While his work appears in assorted publications and calendars, his primary efforts in photography are non-commercial and his shows have been widely acclaimed.



Following the presentation, he will be happy to entertain comments and answer questions on equipment, techniques and the effort involved.

As an international exhibitor he has achieved a 4-star rating in photojournalism, a "galaxy" in color slides, a "photo-naturalist-2" and "galaxy-4" rating in nature, and twice been the recipient of Kodak's prestigious Kinsley Memorial Trophy. He is a past chairman of PSA's Nature division, past president and honorary life vice-president of the Greater Lynn Photographic Association, and current chairman of the Massachusetts Camera Naturalists.

Spring Fling will include the final showing of the Delaware Valley Photo Travel circuit—10 competitions (30 medals)—open to all attendees, stereo card display, vendor tables and more.
