

Our Speakers

Bill Rau

Bill Rau has been an active digital photographer for six years. He focuses on western U.S. land-scapes, especially the Great Plains and desert West, and on old farm buildings--barns, homes, silos. He seeks to capture in his images some of the essence of place.

Bill was President of the Silver Spring Camera Club for two years. He was selected for two photography residencies, one in Montana and one in rural Illinois. He has recent left waged employment after 40 years work in international development and international public health.

Bill will discuss the basics of portfolio development. Participants will come away with an overview of some of the steps in the process of putting together a common set of images, for possible display.

Photo Scavenger Hunt

(on your own time in the morning)

The idea of the Photo Scavenger hunt is to challenge you to capture the image in your camera. The idea is not to see who the best Photoshop person is. To challenge you to go back to basics and be a photographer again, leveling the playing field. Therefore, if you think you can capture the best image shooting RAW, TIF, or JPG, (One of the creative choices you need to make). We will have the most popular memory card readers to download your images, if your memory card takes a special reader or your camera takes a special cable please bring it with you.

We will give Images a point value for difficulty of capture. Images will compete against each other for points awarded by a judging panel. The placement points will be multiplied by the difficulty points and all points added to determine the winners.

For example if the judging gives a point value of 10 and the difficulty point value is 10 the point value for that image is 100. The cumulative score of all the images entered by the member will determine their place in the Hunt. The reason for this scoring method is to level the playing field. You may still be competitive even if you were unable to capture all of the different images. The idea of the Hunt is to show off your photography skills.

Start as early as you want in the morning. Photos must be turned between 12:00 noon and 1:00pm. We will be at the Monterey, 11753 HG Trueman Road, Lusby, MD 20657.

The Rules:

- 1. Images must be captured the day of the Scavenger Hunt. If a sunset is entered, it may be taken the night before the Scavenger Hunt otherwise all images must be taken the day of the Scavenger Hunt.
- 2. Images may be captured anywhere en-route between your home and the meeting place.

- 3. There will be one Wild Card Image; an image of your choosing one that you think will impress the judging and show off your photography skills.
- 4. No Photoshop or other image editing program editing allowed.
- 5. An image can be entered in only one catego-
- 6. Choosing which image to include in the image category is also part of the creative choices. For Example if you capture an image of a fisherman in a row boat with a pelican on the bow of the boat, with an eagle stealing a fish from the pelican in front of a lighthouse that has a sail boat sailing buy and the fisherman is wearing a wild flower in his lapel, as an otter looks at him, and a tobacco barn in the distance, it can only be entered in one category, and that will be your choice. Personally, I would enter this one as a Wild Card image. (A little humor)
 - 7. Images may be color or monochrome.

Directions to The Leonard Residence:

Bob and Ron live on the water at 5895 Rockhold Creek Road in Deale, Maryland. From the Washington Beltway, take Pennsylvania Ave. (Rt. 4) south (outside the Beltway). Go about 12 miles and take Rt. 258 (marked "Bristol/Deale"). There is only one way to go. Stay on Rt. 258 for about 6 miles and turn right on to Rockhold Creek Road. (On the left is Parks Liquor/Citgo gas station.) Go about 4/10 of a mile and turn left down a dirt driveway. Watch for the pink flamingos! Follow the driveway to the white barn. Bill will move through why developing a portfolio (or body of work) is useful and fun. He will discuss how to organize images to begin selecting ones that might fit into a portfolio. A useful step in selecting images for a portfolio is being clear who we are as photographers, and participants will have a chance to begin clarifying for themselves their own selfview. Finally, as a part of the process of selecting images for inclusion in the portfolio, He will ask participants to look at some of his images and narrow the number of images down to a smaller number.

Bill Conway

Bill Conway is a long time member of the Chapter and the Bowie Crofton Camera Club. He has presented programs on digital imaging for us and has lead a Chapter field trip to photograph eagles along the Chesapeake Bay.

Bill will demonstrate the new camera raw 6 in Photoshop CS5. He will do a demo of Camera 6 in conjunction with a demo on High Dynamic Range (HDR). Finally, Bill will discuss cleaning your camera sensor.
